

# THE EMPOWER II PROGRAMME

2020-2022 CASE STUDIES

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### INTRODUCTION

Guiding talented women from all walks of life towards and beyond their business goals has been a real honour for myself and the rest of the EMPOWER team over the past few years. However, the journey has proven to be about more than results alone. Participants have also established valuable networks of like-minded women that will help to support and sustain them into the future and it is ultimately this spirit of female fellowship that makes EMPOWER so special.

The first EMPOWER programme ran from 2017-2019, across the counties of Galway, Mayo and Roscommon through the GMIT Galway and Mayo Innovation Hubs and was managed by Maria Staunton. It was funded by the Government of Ireland and the European Social Fund as part of the Programme for Employability, Inclusion and Learning 2014-2020. Based on the impressive EMPOWER I results, funding was secured to run a second EMPOWER cycle, EMPOWER II\* between 2019 and 2022 and we expanded to a six-county region including Sligo, Leitrim and Donegal. It was delivered through the ATU Innovation Hubs in Galway, Mayo, Sligo and Donegal and I was Project Manager and business mentor.

This booklet showcases just some of the female founders who completed the EMPOWER II cycle. Inside, you'll find a diverse selection of businesses; software, social enterprises, retail, food, beauty, consultancy and more with an age profile ranging from 21 to 65. Each case study provides information on the entrepreneur, their business, their experience on EMPOWER and the benefits and challenges of being a female founder in Ireland today.

EMPOWER delivers two distinct programmes.

EMPOWER START is designed for those with an idea who are seeking to validate their business concept while EMPOWER GROWTH is for individuals established in business and looking to grow and scale.

Supporting female founders to fast track their business development is a source of economic growth for the West and North West of Ireland. The demand for places on the programmes demonstrates the level of interest in entrepreneurship and the need for support. 170 women applied for 64 places on the EMPOWER I cycle. This increased to over 470 applications for 65 places

on the EMPOWER II cycle. Over 320 applications were received for the START programme and 150 for the GROWTH programme. This is indicative of the wealth of talent and innovative thinking that's out there and I believe that tapping into the potential of that in the longer term is certainly something we need to commit to as a country.

The figures really do speak for themselves. A recent survey of EMPOWER past participants revealed that, since completing the programme, 48% of the businesses had entered new markets. There was also a 70% increase in the number of products or services provided. Furthermore, EMPOWER businesses have reported growth of 56% in their national customer base and 47% globally. A total of 146 new employees have been hired since programme completion and €1.2 million investment has been collectively secured along with various vouchers, grants and innovation partnerships.

The benefits of the programmes were even more wide-ranging. During the EMPOWER II cycle, 30 ATU students completed work placements and assignments in EMPOWER businesses and some of our founders also gave guest lectures to the ATU students. The Local Enterprise Offices in the region also played a pivotal role, providing additional training, support and business mentoring to the EMPOWER participants. WDC, Westbic and the women in business networks also collaborated to support these female founders in many different ways and local radio stations and newspapers shared the participants' stories to inspire and build on the thriving community of female founders in the region. This cross-sectoral support and encouragement was fundamentally important to the writing of the EMPOWER success story and we are very grateful to all who got involved.

These female founders showed remarkable courage, resilience, tenacity and creativity as they managed to start and grow businesses during the exceptionally difficult and uncertain trading conditions which arose due to the COVID 19 pandemic. These business owners created a strong, supportive network where friendships and business relationships were formed and significant results were achieved and I have no doubt that the full scale of their achievements is yet to be revealed.

She holds Masters Degrees in both Management and Executive Coaching and spent 25 years in senior management roles for multinational organizations across financial services, banking and manufacturing sectors. Her extensive corporate experience has given her insight into how the pressures and stresses of life and work can adversely affect mental health

Founded in 2015, PAUSE is an online coaching service that delivers measurable mental well being improvements for large organisations. The company's mission is to help individuals and teams take time to slow down, find a safe space, listen to

themselves, and PAUSE. In doing this, productivity is increased.

Winner of the EMPOWER START 2021 pitch competition, Báirbre's main takeaway was the market research that pushed her to meet and interview people within the HR and CEO community. She was also paired with an experienced mentor whose insight has been invaluable.

Báirbre plans on measuring PAUSE's future growth in terms of profile of conversion and absolute understanding of the market rather than focusing on finances. She also hopes to offer full-time roles to the two people she has trained on her team.

## Carla Rosenkranz

Location: Westport, Co. Mayo

Carla Rosenkranz is focused on changing the way we view economic transactions. From Mayo, she graduated from University College Dublin with a BA in Modern Languages, focusing on Spanish, Italian and German, and is a Cambridge qualified English teacher.

Founded in January 2020, Barterkind is an online exchange platform that aims to create a circular, alternative economy where anything can be bartered. Through the website, members can list their skills and services and be paired to swap skills with others, while earning tradeable tokens for their time. It aims to make

services more accessible to all.

The EMPOWER START programme helped Carla to improve her business vocabulary and gave her the confidence to pitch. Though she has also completed a few other programmes, EMPOWER will always stand out for her due to the lack of competition within the participants.

Barterkind will be piloting in Ireland, but Carla hopes to scale the company internationally. Currently, they are getting ready for investment, and they are hoping to launch by the end of 2022.

EMPOWER START gave me structured guidance. The atmosphere between participants was one of genuine encouragement and support, rather than competition. I received the connections, knowledge and confidence I needed to commit to my venture.

Originally from London, Catherine Devine moved to Ireland in 1999 to study Theological and Biblical Studies in Trinity College Dublin and went on to work as a journalist for 18 years. In 2013, she was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes. She now lives in Donegal with her husband and two children and manages Pumpskynz, her medical accessory brand.

Pumpskynz aims to brighten up the daily routines of those living with diabetes by offering eco-friendly, non-toxic silicone gel covers for insulin pumps and glucose monitoring systems and allowing individuals to personalize their equipment while protecting it from cracks and scratches.

Catherine says the EMPOWER START mentors helped her to understand the potential difficulties of starting a business. She found the programme to be well-structured with the connections forged establishing an amazing network of female founders.

Catherine plans to expand her product line and create employment locally. Catherine's dream is to collaborate with established lifestyle brands to create product lines.

EMPOWER START has given me a solid grounding in what it takes to become a successful entrepreneur. More than that, it has made me a part of a network of inspirational people and opened doors that may have remained closed.

Cumas Ceangal

Location: Tuam, Co. Galway

Caroline O'Shaughnessy worked in administration for many years and trained as an accounting technician. However, her career was put on hold when she developed a disability. On the verge of losing her home, she looked to work online. Caroline set up a profile on UpWork, a platform for freelancers to collaborate with businesses and individuals, and went on to become a top rated member with 100% success. While completing a BA in Business Enterprise and Community Development with Equal Ireland, Caroline founded her business, Cumas Ceangal.

Cumas Ceangal is a non profit social enterprise that helps disabled and other marginalized groups to become freelancers. Caroline helps users to create great first impressions with their profiles and provides mentorship.

Caroline found the FMPOWFR START programme useful because the market research brought up questions she was unaware she needed to address. The programme also taught her the importance of working on her customer persona. Caroline believes that learning to make a Lean Canvas, a one-page live document sheet outlining an entire business, has been a particularly useful exercise.

Cumas Ceangal will initially help users to master Upwork but Caroline hopes to expand to other ecommerce websites. She is also looking towards expansion into the UK.

EMPOWER START was intense but rewarding. It showed me how much I had to learn and the importance of listening to the experts.

Location: Boyle, Co Roscommon

Denise is a digital and content marketing strategist from Roscommon. She holds a BSc degree in Agribusiness and Rural Development and a BA in English Literature and History. Denise has over twenty years' experience helping national and international brands to shape brand presence and attract customers and now offers her expertise through her website, Denise Callan.

The business was founded in early 2020 to help companies tell their stories and improve communications online. Through creating tailored digital content, she helps businesses to reach their target customers and drive sales. Other services include

strategy and planning and coaching and training.

From the EMPOWER START programme, Denise learned that aspects of herself she perceived to be weaknesses could be restructured as strengths. She enjoyed meeting female entrepreneurs from many different sectors, and she found the mentors and administrators to be wonderful.

Denise is looking to recruit an employee to help with less strategic work so that she can focus on delivering her services. She is currently working at capacity, but hopes to become more streamlined in her work and increase turnover.

EMPOWER START was truly empowering. It was an inspirational group of women, and it was wonderful to get positive feedback from the coaches and the team.

### **Elaine Harrington** InForm Physio

Location: Oranmore, Co. Galway

Elaine Harrington has always been focused on personal well-being. After completing a Physiotherapy Degree in Limerick, she spent ten years working in New Zealand and Australia where she completed an MSc in Musculoskeletal Physiotherapy and qualified as a pilates instructor. She returned home to Galway in 2019.

InForm Physio combines traditional physiotherapy with pilates and aims to offer a hands-off management pathway to recovery. As Elaine has experienced motherhood herself, her focus has been directed towards serving pre-and postnatal moms.

Through the EMPOWER START programme, Elaine learned about marketing and market research which helped her to verify that her business was viable. She embraced the idea of womensupporting-women as she saw how the participants encouraged one another.

Elaine hopes to build up her client base in order to open her own space with a treatment room and a pilates studio for rehab focus. In addition, she hopes to eventually hire a team of physiotherapists that she can mentor to the same level of training in pilates.

The EMPOWER START Programme was an inspiring and motivating journey to meet and work with other women in business. To be surrounded and supported by other women and to give them support was really inspiring.

Galway native Fidelma Dunne O'Higgins completed a microbiology degree in NUIG and worked in genetics for several years. She also went on to complete a Masters in Enterprise Systems. Now, after completing several solo exhibitions, Fidelma is pursuing her dream of creating her own business selling Irish art.

Irish Art Emporium gives artists a vehicle to develop and establish an international market selling Irish themed art, originals and prints. It has a significant potential customer base of 70 million people around the world who claim Irish ancestry.

Through EMPOWER START, Fidelma received great support and comradeship. She could rely on those around her to give her names of service providers and noticed that people were very generous with their expertise. As she stated, "What I lacked in my vision other people were able to help me with."

Fidelma's business plans for the future include the onboarding of more Irish based artists. She also intends to recruit a business partner who is in touch with the art community.

EMPOWER START was run by people who were genuinely invested in your success. The positive and supportive environment reflected my values, and the structure and comradeship were very beneficial.

Fran has over 17 years' experience in leadership for nationals and multinational organisations. She now helps leaders and teams to achieve strategic goals and develop their brands through her business, Lissawell Coaching.

Lissawell Coaching offers strengths based coaching, working virtually or in person with organisations. She supports startups and inspires existing businesses, empowering leaders and their teams to use tools and

techniques to optimise performance and make sustainable changes.

Fran's biggest takeaway from the EMPOWER START was the network of women. She got the support she needed and was able to bounce ideas off of her peers. It also enabled her to focus on her core values, giving her the confidence to allow her strengths and authenticity to shine through.

In the future. Fran would love to continue to scale the business. She hopes to continue to improve and help more businesses to prosper.



From Mayo, Lisa Gallagher spent 9 years abroad, learning about many new cultures and had mentors on the way. On returning to Ireland in 2018, she was inspired to start BeYew. She received training as a shamanic practitioner and sound therapist and works to improve mindful and mental wellbeing through focusing on alignment with the natural environment.

BeYew offers courses to promote selfawareness and healing through connections with the elements and sound, all to help customers create harmony and achieve a sense of health, well-being and personal growth. The primary market is females between the ages of 35-55 who are looking to learn skill sets for a sustainable life balance between their career and their responsibilities outside of work, such as children and family.

Lisa enjoyed learning how to run her business while engaging with other entrepreneurs on the EMPOWER START programme. She became motivated to research further into the market, and she developed the confidence to try again after making mistakes.

Lisa's plans for the future business expansion include rebuilding the company website and building a fully comprehensive online school with community forums.

I discovered the difference between how I thought a business should be run and how it actually needs to be run. I found the support of the community to be really empowering, and they helped me through a difficult learning curve.

Based in Athenry, Co. Galway, Margaret Rae is an advocate for the ocean, focused on preparing for a brighter future. Educated to PhD level, she currently works at Rockfield Medical and is the EU Co-Chair of the Atlantic Marine Microbiome Group while developing her business, Konree Innovation Ltd. Margaret was awarded the Inaugural WomenTech EU award 2021-2022.

Founded in March 2021, Konree Innovation is working towards developing ocean technology for aquaculture and ocean monitoring. Passionate about preparing a better future, Margaret is working towards a new strategy to change the paradigm in

ocean awareness. Her initial target market is Norway, which has a majority of salmon aquaculture.

Margaret found the EMPOWER START very useful, for it addressed the daily obstacles women face. She enjoyed the collaborative nature of the programme and how everyone helped each other out.

Margaret is in the process of adding a co-founder to Konree Innovation. First, she plans on bringing her technology to a prototype stage to move forward with funding, grants and other investments to become a production prototype.

EMPOWER START improves the prospects for women by further preparing us for the obstacles we face day-to-day, especially as entrepreneurs. Because it is a women's network, the collaborative network was a fantastic aspect.

Michelle enjoyed EMPOWER START for the strong support network it provided. She also appreciated the support of the ATU group, mentors and speakers. These contacts did not stop when the programme ended, for Michelle still has a lifelong community to rely upon for help.

In the future, Michelle wants Fit Fun Adventures to be a platform for all 32 counties. She hopes to continue to develop the proper software for her website and expand the company to have a greater base of more activity listings.

EMPOWER START has enabled me to step back and challenge the idea and take time out from working in the business to focus on the strategic level of the business.

family have provided since the doors first opened in 1948. They also have worked to expand the business' online presence and introduce more services and products.



The programme can be summed up in three words: an excellent support network. It truly was a programme I learned a lot from.



Asumpta completed EMPOWER START in 2018 and GROWTH in 2021, and found both to be extremely helpful. Other participants served as a mini board of directors sharing valuable feedback. Asumpta also found that monthly meetings provided accountability to complete short-term business goals.


She hopes to develop a full consultancy business that will supply services not only to general practice but to other areas within the healthcare sector and to build a team of professionals.

Following her studies in Equine Science at the University of Limerick, Carly graduated from the Ingraham Academy of Applied Zoopharmacognosy (UK) and relocated to Ireland over 30 years ago. She has worked with horses for over 25 years, breeding and training as well as teaching riding lessons.

Whitethorne Equine Health offers a natural approach to healing horses. Through the use of herbs and essential oils, each animal's unique ability to self-medicate is enabled. The company provides one-toone mentoring, equine and canine

workshops, an in-person clinic and sells herbs and essential oils online.

Through EMPOWER GROWTH, Carly was inspired to move online, which was a huge pivot in the business. She was also inspired to get out with a camera and film her work and found the support, network and lead mentors to be very helpful.

In the future, Carly is hoping to open a clinic for people to bring their horses. She would also like to make her workshops accessible throughout the globe. Lastly, she would like to publish research on race horse's ability to self-medicate.

Looking to the future, Trish plans to sell online content template packages that include purchase options for PR strategy, social media, action plans and website building.






The Sligo Oyster Experience offers unique guided tours of the farm and an oyster tasting experience.
